Oracle won't allow anyone else to repair their servers, claiming repair trespasses on their "intellectual property."

Their methods are different, but the goal is the same: monopolize the repair market.

Technology is essential to modern life. When things break, we need to fix them quickly. Local repair businesses are essential to the economy, but they're facing more threats than ever before.
